AN ESTIMATE of the EXPENSE of the EQUIPMENT of Her Majesty's Ship "North Star," for the purpose of taking out a Supply of Provisions, &c. for the Crews of Her Majesty's Ships "Investigator" and "Enterprise," employed on an Expedition to the Arctic Regions.

For the Repairs and Equipment of the Hull, and Masts, Yards and Stores for Sea - For Wages of the Crew of Her Majesty's Ship "North Star," for Nine Months - 1,500 - 800 - 500 Ordnance Stores - 700 O

The whole Charge amounts to the Sum of Twelve Thousand Six Hundred and Eighty-eight Pounds. No actual budget given for Proposed Ross expedition. See next slide for modern currency conversions

HIGHLIGHTS

- Preserved meats for the Austin expedition and the North Star cache were provided by Goldner
 - In a report on the quality of the preserved meat provided by Goldner, 95% of the items were found suitable for consumption (Hansard HC Deb., 12 February 1852)
- Lemon juice and sugar allocated for lemon juice were always
 1:1
- Flour, beef (8 pound units), sugar, and vinegar were the only items included in all three cases in the same unit of measurement
- The expedition under Captain Austin had the most detailed and varied provisions list, including items such as:
 - Live oxen
 - Hops
 - Cayenne pepper
